Last night, in Colorado's First District, AIPAC lost.

Denver elected Melat Kiros as the Democratic nominee to Congress and ousted a 30-year establishment Democrat who refused to call for an arms embargo to stop a genocide.

In the final weeks, corporate dark money flooded the race to stop Melat — much of it from AIPAC, Amazon, and Lockheed Martin — in a last-ditch attempt to stop Melat. And they smeared Melat as antisemitic for refusing to stay silent about Israel's genocide.



That is where JVP Action came in. We are done allowing Super PACs to attack bold leftists and progressives who are speaking out for Palestinian freedom — and we know how to fight back. We made Melat's fight our fight — Jews for Melat members joined an incredible field operation that knocked on more than 100,000 doors, and spoke out publicly as Jewish Denverites in support of Melat.

Melat won because organizations mobilized grassroots people power to talk with voters across the district — and because her campaign gave people something to vote for. She was the only candidate in the race rejecting corporate PAC money.



She ran on Medicare for All, Housing First, Universal Childcare, abolishing ICE, and an arms embargo on Israel. She made the connections explicit: the same billionaires who keep our prices high and burn our planet are the ones profiting from genocide. That is the politics we are building: Palestine woven into the fight for working people.

Melat is our eleventh win this year.

JVP Action's slate is rattling the Democratic establishment coast to coast — Rev. Frederick Haynes III in Dallas, Rep. Chris Rabb in Philadelphia, Dr. Adam Hamawy in New Jersey, Ruwa Romman for State Senate in Georgia, and a New York sweep that is sending Claire Valdez and Darializa Avila Chevalier to Congress and elected Aber Kawas, David Orkin, Samantha Kattan, and Diana Moreno to the State Legislature. And now Melat Kiros in Colorado.

Our next fights are our biggest yet.

For the first time ever, JVP Action is endorsing a candidate for the United States Senate: Abdul El-Sayed in Michigan. Michigan is a battleground that helps decide who wins the White House — and we intend to win it.

Meanwhile, we are on the ground every week in St. Louis organizing to send Cori Bush - one our biggest champions in DC - back to Congress, after AIPAC bought her seat in 2024.
